Oversized Garbage Disposal Guide

While living in Japan, you might become overwhelmed with the complex rules on garbage disposal. Here are some simple tips that might be helpful:

Oversized Garbage:

Furniture, electronics, futons, bicycles, and items 30cm or longer. (Air conditioners, TV, refrigerator/freezer, washing machine and computers DO NOT fall under this category)

It is required by law that you contact the Meguro Oversized Garbage Center to dispose of the items. Please inquire below.

Air Conditioner, TV, Refrigerator/Freezer and Washing Machine:

By law, it is your responsibility to recycle. Please contact the original seller of the item to dispose, or the seller of the replacement. However, if the seller does not provide any recycling services, you may also inquire the Household Appliance Recycling Center:

Personal Computers:

"Japanese Pictograms to be Revamped! "

Have you ever had a problem not using advanced Japanese toilets?

The Japanese toilets are popular among foreigners, but at the same time it has been pointed out that the pictograms on the control panel are hard to understand, and that there are no standard pictograms across different manufactures.

Considering the inconveniences, "The Japan Sanitary Equipment Industry Association" in Nagoya composed of the major toilet manufactures decided to introduce standardized pictograms on the toilet control panels in 2017.

Moreover the Ministry of Economy, Trade and Industry (METI) announced that they would redesign pictograms other than toilet-related with which foreigners get easily confused. METI will be launching the new designs on July 20, 2017.
